Call for articles for Liberian Security Sector Reform book

Dear Ladies and Gentlemen,

The Security Sector Reform Think Tank of the Kofi Annan Institute for Conflict Transformation is pleased to invite nationals and international practitioners, academic scholars, policy makers, security sector officers, civil society representatives and the SSR community in general to submit an article for the **Liberian Security Sector Reform Book** to be launched on 26 June 2017.

The book is being organized by the University of Liberia with the support of the United Nations Mission with the objective to encourage the production of local knowledge about the SSR process in the country.

The book will discuss the fourteen years of security sector reform in Liberia since the end of civil war through articles with critical analysis from the sociological, anthropological, political, historical, legal, and economic perspectives. Analysis can focus on the challenges, opportunities and success stories of national ownership, policy and strategy-making processes, international law, democratic governance, specific institutions' reform, criminal justice, customary/informal institutions, gender, human security, and human rights.

The authors of the articles selected for the book will be paid a total amount of USD 150 (one hundred and fifty dollars) to cover research expenses.

Kindly note the submission guidelines:

- (a) Article on the subject of SSR in Liberia with a clear objective, introduction, development, analysis, conclusion and book references.
- (b) Name of the author with short biography highlighting the main academic and professional experiences
- (c) The article of 15-25 pages, font Times New Roman and size 12.
